Learn another Language... College Lingo!

Advisement-Process of discussing courses, programs, majors, goals, & career planning, and other aspects of academic life between student and Navigator (Advisor), Counselor &/or faculty advisor. Should be done *each* semester, but is available year-round.

Course Format—In person, on campus (ML, AC or CM), online (asynchronous with *no* live interactions), hybrid (on campus 1x/week & online requirements), or remote/virtual (online, with required virtual attendance at the specified times). You'll join your instructor and class via Blackboard Collaborate and/or via Zoom-the instructor would provide specifics).

Degree-Associate's, may be AA, AS, AFA, AAS-each with a different balance of academic (general education courses) and program (major-specific) courses. E.g. AS=Associate in Science (doesn't mean you are taking a science program).

Major (or program)-The subject of your academic program. E.g. *Psychology* (AA degree), *Nursing* (AAS degree), *Criminal Justice* (AS degree).

Prerequisite-A course or placement needed before taking a particular course.

Registration-Selecting course(s) & section(s) and adding it to your schedule. This is different than pre-planning. Registering is official & incurs tuition & fee charges & means you have "saved" your seat in the class.

Self Service-Your online student portal used to plan classes, register, pay for classes, view transcript, make payments, and view financial aid & final grades.

2023-24 FAFSA is open and ready for you to complete! Financial aid is for a school year (fall/spring) and should be completed each year. Once you file, wait 7-10 days and then check your Self Service Financial Aid Account information for *Required Documents*-complete, hand-sign and upload these so your eligibility can be determined. Your financial aid is not complete until this is done, reviewed and posted on your account, under *Awards*.
