University Partnerships

• Dr. Barbara Gaba and Chancellor Dr. Antonio D. Tillis of Rutgers University-Camden officially signed a memorandum of understanding on February 14th in Atlantic Cape's Mays Landing campus STEM Building, creating a *Premier Partnership* between the two institutions of higher education. This partnership will create new educational opportunities for Atlantic Cape students to seamlessly continue their undergraduate education at Rutgers University-Camden through a sequential degree program once they have earned their respective associate's degree at Atlantic Cape. It will also allow participating students to fully matriculate into Rutgers University-Camden with 60 completed credits, pay the Atlantic Cape tuition and fee rate for their third year, and expand access to higher education in Atlantic and Cape May counties and the State of New Jersey.

Baseball Groundbreaking

Atlantic Cape Community College officially broke ground on its new \$1.48 million baseball field of dreams on its Mays Landing campus on February 15th, 2024, that will permanently bring the Buccaneers' baseball program home in time for the 2025 season after spending the past decade playing its home games at Surf Stadium in Atlantic City. To drum up support for this ambitious

project, the Atlantic Cape Foundation created the "Bring it Home" fundraising campaign in 2020 and thanks to the generosity of its donors, raised \$186,000. With sixty in attendance, from county commissioners, members of the college's Board of Trustees, staff, faculty and alumni to players and coaches from the current baseball team, many were recognized for ensuring that this momentous project came to fruition. Remarks for this event included Dr. Gaba, Chairwoman Commissioner Kern, Foundation Executive Board Member, Stephen Nehmad Coach Muckle, and Athletics Director Jamal Edwards.

Boys and Girls Club of Atlantic City

Boys & Girls Club leaders Dr. Charles A. Wallace II, CEO, and Anthony C.
 Culpepper, Jr., Director of Career and College Preparedness, met Dr. Gaba at the Worthington Atlantic City Campus. - The College hosted the southern venue portion of the 2024 New Jersey State Indoor Archery Championships in Jonathan Pitney Gymnasium on the Mays Landing campus from February 3rd to February 4th as the Buccaneers' Archery team opened the Spring semester half of its 2023-24 season. This annual USA Archery event brought archers from New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, and Maryland, as well as Atlantic Cape and Rowan University, to the college to compete in nearly 30 categories. Participants competed in skill categories ranging from as young as under-13 to as experienced as 70+.
