

AVIATION PROGAM GUIDELINES

- 1. Complete the free online college application at www.admissions@atlanticcape.edu/apply.
- 2. Complete financial aid and scholarship applications. For questions, visit the college's website at www.atlanticcape.edu/finaid or email finaid@atlanticcape.edu.
- 3. Take the placement test or submit SAT/ACT scores, or if transferring from another college, have official transcripts sent to the Admissions Office electronically at <u>transcripts@atlanticcape.edu</u> or to the Admissions Office, 5100 Black Horse Pike, Mays Landing, NJ 08330.
- 4. Complete the attached form **with the required documents** and submit to *aviation@atlanticapec.edu*, or mail to the Aviation Department, Atlantic Cape Community College, 5100 Black Horse Pike, Mays Landing, NJ 08330:
 - a. Proof of US citizenship (passport or birth certificate). Non-US citizens must have proof of approval from the Transportation Security Administration (TSA). Contact the Aviation Studies Department for assistance in obtaining approval.
 - b. FAA Class I medical certificate for Professional Pilot. Class II FAA medical certificate for Professional Helicopter and Air Traffic Control. Refer to the following link for a list of FAA approved medical examiners: https://flightphysical.com/ame-directory/new-jersey
 - c. Current driver's license.
 - d. If you are a veteran, include your Certificate of Eligibility. If you do not have a Certificate of Eligibility, contact the Veterans Call Center at 1-888-442-4551.
- 5. Meet with the Aviation Advisor to schedule courses for the upcoming semester.
- 6. Register for classes.
- 7. Pay for classes or make arrangements for the payment plan with the Bursar's Office, bursar@atlanticcape.edu. Tuition and fees are listed on our website, https://www.atlanticcape.edu/admission/costs.php

Information for Veteran Students

Veteran students must have a Certificate of Eligibility on file with Maria Giordano, Veterans Certifying Official, in lieu of payment. If a student is not 100% VA funded, the student is responsible for the balance of tuition and fees. For questions, email *mgiordan@atlanticcape.edu*. Veteran students must be pursuing a degree. The VA has strict regulations on the percentage of VA funded students enrolled in flight programs. Known as the 85/15 rule, this regulation prohibits paying VA education benefits to students enrolling in a degree program when more than 85% of the students enrolled in that program are having any portion of their tuition, fees, or other charges paid for them by the VA.

Acceptance into either of the pilot programs is contingent upon Atlantic Cape meeting the 85/15 rule.
