Dear Atlantic Cape Alumni, First and foremost, I hope that you and you families are healthy and safe. Over the past several weeks, the Novel

Coronavirus (COVID-19) has developed into a global pandemic that poses enormous and unprecedented challenges to our communities. I wanted to use this opportunity to reach out to you with an update on what we have been doing at Atlantic Cape to respond to this crisis and to continue to provide our students and community members with the services and support they need during this difficult time.

First, to protect the health of our students and faculty and to enable them to practice social distancing, all course instruction will be delivered online for the remainder of the Spring semester. We did not make this decision lightly, and in anticipation of the challenges it may pose for students, we have set up a number of support services that can be utilized remotely. Students that do not have their own personal computer will be able to borrow a laptop from the College so that they can successfully complete their coursework at home. Additionally, our free online tutoring services have been expanded. Our bookstore has gone online with free shipping, and our library offers a wide variety of digital resources that are accessible 24/7. Our dedicated team members in Admissions, Financial Aid, and Counseling are ready to provide assistance by phone and email, and our Academic Advisors will be reaching out to every student over the coming weeks to schedule phone and video chat appointments.

Additionally, we are doing all that we can to address the essential needs of our community members through donations of food and supplies. Our campus food pantries have distributed food and Shop Rite gift cards to students in need, and additional packaged food items from both the campus food pantries and the Culinary program's storeroom have been donated to local food pantries and food banks. Our Nursing Program was able to donate its supply of masks, gloves, and other personal protective equipment (PPE) to AtlantiCare Regional Medical Center and Cape Regional Medical Center to protect our heroic healthcare workers as they work tirelessly to care for their patients.

As we continue to navigate this extraordinary situation, it is more important than ever to come together as one Atlantic Cape family to support and take care of one another. If you are able to do so, please consider making a donation to the Atlantic Cape Foundation. These funds will provide critical emergency assistance to our students who have been adversely affected financially by this crisis. 2020 President's Distinguished Alumni Award



Mayor Beth Holtzman '82 Business Administration, A.S.

Beth Holtzman knew by her junior year in high school that she wanted to pursue a career in accounting. After graduating in the top 15% of her class, she attended Atlantic Cape and earned an A.S. in Business Administration in 1982. She continued on to Stockton, obtaining a B.S. in Business and Accounting in 1985.

After working in the hospitality industry in Atlantic City and Washington D.C., Beth returned to the area and took a job as an accountant for Atlantic County. She eventually worked her way up to Fiscal Officer. In June 2020, Beth will mark 31 years of service to the Atlantic County government. In May 2016, Beth was sworn in as mayor in Ventnor City. She is very active in the community having served as the Treasurer for the Ventnor Little League, a Ventnor City School Board member, and the State of New Jersey Support Group Leader for the CARES Foundation.

Richard Russell, Jr. '99 General Studies, A.S. and Liberal Arts, A.A.

Richard Russell has a life-long connection to Atlantic Cape, starting as a child attending the daycare located on the Mays Landing Campus and as an attendee of the Kid's College program. In 1999, Rich obtained an A.A. in Liberal Arts and an A.S. in General Studies. He later graduated magna cum laude from

NYU with a B.A. in English, from the New School University with a M.S. in Teaching, and from the University of London with a M.A. in English. After years of teaching high school English, Rich joined the faculty ranks at Atlantic Cape in January 2007. He was promoted to Assistant Professor of English in January 2014 and served as the English Department Coordinator from January 2014 to May 2019. He has earned numerous professional awards including the Faculty Pioneer Award in 2012 and Faculty of the Year in 2019. Rich supports several Atlantic Cape scholarships and is the advisor for Rewrites, the college's literary magazine.



Dennis Kelly '78 Liberal Arts, A.A.

While a student at Atlantic Cape, Dennis Kelly earned four varsity letters in three different sports and was a featured columnist for the college paper.
